He was born in Gainesville, Florida, in 1957 and moved with his family in 1962 to Montevallo, Alabama, where he grew up. He currently lives in Fairhope, Alabama, with his wife. Mr. Sledge has had a successful career as a journalist and author. He graduated from Auburn University with a bachelor's degree in history and Spanish. He achieved his master's degree in historic preservation from Middle Tennessee State University. Mr. Sledge is a senior architectural historian for the Mobile, Alabama Historic Development Commission. He began working for the Commission in 1985. He was a newspaper Book Page editor for the *Mobile Press-Register*, writing over eight hundred articles during his career there. He has published journal articles, is a National Book Critics Circle member, and has published books about the Gulf Coast region and its history. Scope and Content:
